As we head into September we want to keep you as up to date as possible with the services taking place across the team. Hopefully we will have good news to share with you in due course.

We would like to continue to reassure you that we will produce and send out resources for you and provide the online service for as long as we need to, so that those who don't feel it is time to physically attend are still part of our worshipping community.

This week's resources continue to reflect the season of Creationtide, including a letter written by the Most Reverend Dr Thabo Cecil Makgoba, Archbishop of Cape Town, to Justin Welby reflecting on what it means to care for creation in his context. He speak with honesty about the challenges caused by climate change in his province. The challenge in this week's gospel reading is 'if another member of the church sins against you, go and point out the fault when the two of you are alone.' The flip side of the challenge is to listen to the members who come to speak with us – that we might be reconciled. This season a whole host of Archbishops have been asked to speak out against the impact we are having on this planet – are we ready to listen to them and be reconciled?
